

Weather Summary for Antigua and Barbuda March 2010

Antigua experienced near normal rainfall during March. The total for the month was 1.52 inches, while the normal is 2.14 inches (1971 – 2000). The rainfall total for this month was 71% of the normal total. Over in Barbuda, the rainfall total was above the period average at Park. The total for the month was 3.32 inches, while the period average is 1.62 inches (1993 – 2009). Cold fronts contributed most to the rainfall total for the month.

Coolidge had a mean temperature of 26.9°C or 80.4°F, which was well above normal and the highest ever on record for March. Coolidge also had a maximum temperature of 32.9°C, which was well above normal and the highest ever for the month (1971 – 2010).
